AAJA-LA MID-YEAR SCHOLARSHIPS

The Los Angeles Chapter of the Asian American Journalists Association (AAJA) is offering up to \$10,000 in scholarships for students attending colleges or universities in the greater Los Angeles area during the 2010-2011 school year. Last year, students were awarded grants of \$500 to \$2,500.

Deadline for applications to be RECEIVED is Wednesday, November 3. Winners will receive their awards in November during a special reception with industry professionals.

Applications and work samples will be reviewed by a panel of judges led by KTLA Morning News Co-Anchor Frank Buckley and Los Angeles Times Assistant Managing Editor Henry Fuhrmann.

- 1) Applicants must be committed to AAJA's mission
- 2) Applicants must demonstrate journalistic excellence, a strong interest in pursuing journalism as a career, and a commitment to community involvement.
- 3) Applicants must be enrolled full-time in a Southern California area college or university with at least 12 credit units each semester for the Fall of 2010 and the Spring of 2011 school year. Applicants must be taking journalism or related courses and/ or pursuing a career in journalism.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Candidate will be selected on the basis of academic achievement, demonstrated journalistic ability, financial need, commitment to the field of journalism and/or sensitivity to Asian American and Pacific Islander issues. Individual scholarships may weigh criteria differently and/ or take into account other factors.

AAJA membership is encouraged for all applicants and required for the selected scholarship recipients. For membership, please apply at: www.aaja.org.

HOW TO APPLY

Please read the following instructions carefully. Submit four complete, collated sets (one original, three copies) of each of the following items. Uses paper clips, not staples.

- 1) COMPLETE APPLICATION FORM.
- 2) RESUME: Must be on one single-sided 8.5" x 11" sheet of paper. List your educational background, work history, awards, journalism-related internships, other scholarships, language proficiency and any work done for your school or community newspaper, radio and/or television.
- 3) ACADEMIC TRANSCRIPT: Transcripts may not be sent separately.
- 4) TWO LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION: Letters should come from a professional who is familiar with your academic and/ or journalism work.
- 5) SHORT ESSAY: The essay should not exceed 500 words, must be typed and double-spaced. Please respond to the following: Describe any involvement or interest you have in the Asian American/ Pacific Islander community. If you were awarded an AAJA scholarship, propose how you would contribute to the field of journalism and media issues involving the Asian American and Pacific Islander community.
- **6) WORK SAMPLES:** Note that samples will not be returned.

Please provide **links to work samples** and/or submit work samples in the following manner. *Note* If links don't open properly and hard copies/ tapes/ DVDs/ CDs are not provided, applicant may be removed from consideration

PHOTOJOURNALISM APPLICANTS: Please submit a portfolio containing no more than 10 entries. A picture story is considered one entry. Published and unpublished photographs will be considered. Entries may be black-and-white or color prints, slides, clippings, CDs or URLs. Prints/ clippings should be no larger than 8.5′ x 11′. Complete caption information must be included along with the images.

PRINT APPLICANTS: Send four copies up to four articles photocopied or printed on 8.5′ x 11′. Do not send tear sheets or term papers.

BROADCAST APPLICANTS: Radio applicants should send up to three stories (total length of less than 10 minutes) all copied onto four CDs. TV applicants should send up to three stories (total length of less than 10 minutes) copied onto four DVDs. **Tip:** If you need to transfer VHS to DVD, try your local photocopy business center, pharmacy or online video copying services.
